# the President's Lens

Apart from running out of orange juice, our November 09 film night was a thrill for our members as no one was allowed to get bored due to the variety of interesting travel and documentary videos that complemented the drama.

Afterwards, I got together with Colin Schumacher who as you know is a respected film critic and examiner. Colin suggested that the trend in short films today is to make it even

shorter while raising the impact; "you can say a lot in 3 minutes".

In 2009 we finally got many members out of "theory" stage and into the "actually doing it" one. With 5 club competitions plus VOTY you certainly had a lot of practice.

This year our emphasis will shift to quality rather than quantity so we have reduced the number of club competitions from five to three ( plus VOTY).

We also changed the timing of these competitions so that we are not bunching them up, January "On board" deadline for instance has now been extended to March club night will give you more time to think, and puts less pressure on our volunteer.

- 1. For "short" drama films direct your actors accordingly, long pauses are for long films, keep it snappy.
- Keep the titles short, with ever increasing films we have to keep things moving
- Think about how you are going to "fool' the Audience with a "twist" in the plot. This year you are going to have more time to think about your clever scripts so start planning now.

As film making is a most rewarding area of the arts, combining creativity with technology, I feel that one needs time to bring out the inner consciousness into reality, also needs time to think about the technical aspects, such as framing, lighting and quality of sound, something that often escaped the beginner

#### **1. STRATEGIC CHANGE.**

During the holidays the committee reviewed club rules and made many sensible changes as a result of the club's natural evolution and your suggestions. It must be said that this complex task of working through hundreds of amendments, cross referencing, was capably undertaken by Ian Scott without whom it would have been an absolute nightmare, I am truly impressed.

Kent Fry will outline the changes and what it means to you at the January Club night and in the following article, I would like to thank the subcommittee that included long term members Andy Doldissen and Eddie Hanham for their massive input. Kent is also our international club liaison officer who exchanges reels to show us how the overseas clubs do it.

#### 2. FOCUS.

We will maintain our commitment to help members improve skills by having a couple of beginners day time training sessions (on Saturdays) at the club. This enables us to make the Focus Nights less beginner-oriented. On Focus Nights members are encouraged to bring their Cameras and Laptops to have specific problems solved by mentors or others with similar software. We will also see the return of travel night Videos.

#### **3. COMMITTEE CHANGES.**

Let's thank the following people who are stepping down after many years of loyal dedication starting with Gary Murdoch, who has resigned from the club to concentrate on many other interests. Gary is a much

also stepped down from the committee but will continue to help out and enjoy the club.

# COMPETITION RULES AND SCREENING PROCEDURES

### **PROPOSED CHANGES**

#### 1. BACKGROUND.

The club activity focus has changed to encourage member cooperation in teams. Individuals can participate in competitions as well as share in the competition between teams. This change in focus has meant that the



screening procedures are no longer a perfect fit for the revised club operation. The Committee therefore proposed some changes to accommodate the new operational focus.

In addition to the Committee initiative it is noted that a few members questioned and complained about the fairness of competitions and the judging process. In particular, they questioned the Competition Manager's impartiality. The Committee know that this criticism is totally uninformed, unjustified and inappropriate. The records and facts support this committee stance. Nevertheless, we have made some changes to ensure additional transparency of the judging process in the future.

The Committee set up a rules review subcommittee comprising:

The subcommittee reviewed the existing document and member inputs then suggested some changes. Ian Scott synthesised the changes and the subcommittee debated them. A new set of rules was ultimately proposed.

### 2. MAJOR CHANGES

• Length of productions now explicitly excludes tape leaders and credits and is logically defined;

- Gold, silver and bronze ranking of club night competition results has been abandoned;
- For VOTY, individuals may submit two entries, teams may submit two entries and club night competition entries which scored more than 75% may be entered these entries are mutually exclusive, so it is possible for a member to be involved in submission of more than four entries;
- Professional entry is excluded, but is defined as using professional studios, external financial support or external resources. All other entries are consider amateur;
- Awards are now collectively called "Recognition of Achievement"
- Judges will continue to be external to the club. If for any reason this is impossible, they must:
  - be identified to the President; not take any part in the competition they are judging.
- Meeting night videos are eligible for VOTY if they score 75% or more in a club night competition.
- **P** and PG Film classifications are removed in favour of selfregulation of content. More adult content is now allowed in accordance with guidelines included in the proposed rules
- Each category of video is now adequately defined together with principle evaluation criteria for each category

"Screenplay" is now correctly renamed "Drama";

"Animation" is now renamed "Special Techniques" and includes animation of any technology style and any other experimental video, including such things as "Ken Burns" effect or slide shows where the special technique is more dominant than the story.

### 3. WORK STILL TO BE DONE

The work is not yet finished. We have yet to rework the judging/appraisal form and the entry form. At this stage, it is likely that the judging sheet for each category will be different, although no final decisions have been taken. The

entry form will endeavour to improve managing the old bugbear of "Copyright", both from the point of view of legal protection for the club and inequity amongst member videos. We expect that this work will be completed by mid February.

#### 4. PROCEDURAL ISSUES

In addition to the rule changes, your committee also changed several associated procedures. The most important of these:

- in future There will only be three meeting night competitions and VOTY per year.
- All meeting night entries must be supplied to the Competition Manager on five separate DVDs and tape will not be accepted. Four of the DVDs will be used for sending one to each of the four judges for that competition and one will be retained by the competition manager as a backup. This will absolve the Competition Manager of the error prone requirement to duplicate entries for judges. This of course passes the responsibility for entry quality squarely back onto the entrant.

#### **5. COMPETITION MANAGER**

Mike Elton was understandably stung by the unjustified criticism leveled at him by a very small minority of members. He has resigned from the competition manager position to ensure that future competitions can be established with no hangovers from the past.

Mike, we thank you for your three years of hard work and trust that you can now just enjoy making videos.

Margaret Tulloh has volunteered to assume the role of Competition Manager in addition to her other club roles as editor of Electronic Eye and Caterer.

#### 6. CONSTITUTION

The changes in competition rules have led to the need to make a few changes in the Constitution. These will be advised soon and membership will be asked to vote on the constitutional changes soon.

#### 7. SUMMARY

The competition rules have been reworked and a draft will be available on the Club's website following the January club night meeting. <u>http://www.sydneyvideomakers.org.au/Document\_Downloads.htm</u>. The old rules will also be there for another month or so to enable you to compare them at your leisure. The constitution will need some minor amendment to reflect the rule changes. You will be asked to vote on the changes at a Special General Meeting in the near future.

Mike Elton resigned as Competition Manager and is replaced by Margaret Tulloh.

It is worth stressing at this point that the competition manager does not do any judging and is tasked only to arrange judging by others, consolidate the judges results and keep records of the various competition results and determinations arrived at after consolidation of judges results.


We expect that the new rules will apply in concept after the January club night with only minor adjustments required to finalise the formal documents.

The key decision components here are camera complexity on the vertical or y axis and editing complexity on the horizontal or x axis.

The second part of the evening will be spent discussing camera controls. In order to make this a success, please bring your video camera's **AND** your camera instruction manual. There will be several more advanced members who can help you figure out your camera controls and how to use them.


So come along and talk cameras.

The last thing I was involved with was VOTY which was a great success. Video of the Year was "Korean Play Group" by Andy Doldissen. It also was awarded first prize in the Documentary section, and was given the award for Audience Popular Vote.

The animation award went to Ernest Cheung and Kent Fry for "My Camera Talks". There was not a lot of animation but lots of stills were used to tell an instructional story.

Kent Fry won both the Gwen Stony

lot of comments. It suffered from a bad soundtrack which became worse when it was shown. Also I should have entered it as a travel video which it really was with the addition of sound effects and overlays of photos of soldiers etc.

Overall VOTY was a success but with a few caveats. First I thought that several entrees were too long perhaps 7 minutes (like Tropfest) would be a good length. It may have been better if we had replayed some of the entrees that had been shown during the year.

Also we need to try to cull some which were repetitious or with too small an appeal. In any case the rules of

the club and entrees into competitions are being studied by a committee and will be discussed at our next meeting night.

One subject we have been discussing is the number and timing of contests. It has been decided to reduce the number of contests down to

### My NCC history

I attended my first meeting in March 1996 as a visitor & commenced membership from April 1996 and assisted Chris Korgemets as the audio operator shortly after. So my membership was just a few months short of 14 years.

**I** was invited by president Earl Hingston to serve on the committee to fill a casual vacancy and attended my first committee meeting on 14<sup>th</sup> May 1997 and remained on the committee until the AGM in 2004 (just over 7 years) because the Club's committee night clashed with another ongoing commitment.

I had the pleasure of being the projectionist (or assistant projectionist) for the Club's VOTY event. This was an annual function where a number of members' videos were screened on (from memory) the January meeting night. The winner was awarded the Video of the Year.

Following a Club Shoot in May 1998, ironically called 'North Side Story' (a comic stage show using parents and teachers and directed by Jan Cairns at Killara High to raise funds for the school), John Urquhart made a 'deal' with the school that the Club in return, would use their auditorium to screen the club's VOTY entries. This marked the first VOTY that was held outside the



Dougherty Centre and was the pattern of all VOTY's to follow.

In 1999 the venue for VOTY had changed to the ROXY theatre at Film Australia, Lindfield.

**Th**e ROXY has seen some interesting VOTY developments over the years – in 2001 the entire screening was performed (even the interval music) from a Premiere timeline on a PC which fed a large Barco projector.

Following a storm in 2003, we had major

blackouts in the CBD and Lindfield and it looked very much like VOTY would not proceed, but power was finally restored minutes before the guests arrived.

In 2004, the night had a Charlie Chaplin theme and guests were literally given the red carpet treatment thanks to Louise Furney's organisation of the event. We have used a somewhat simpler format since.


